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How to reset whirlpool gold series ice maker

To reset your Whirlpool ice maker, do one of the following: Adjust the feeler armPress the reset buttonPress the on/off switchUnplug the appliance Resetting a Whirlpool ice maker is super simple. Are you ready to find out how to reset yours now and enjoy a refreshing drink after dinner tonight? Then let's dive in to the ice-cold details. Enjoy a refreshing glass of iced tea after you've reset your Whirlpool Ice Maker! Is your Whirlpool ice maker making slushies instead of ice cubes? Or has it stopped working altogether? Whatever the case, a simple reset should solve your problem. Check out the following steps that will explain what you should do to reset your Whirlpool ice maker. Adjust the Feeler Arm Adjust the what? Ok, I get it. When you first read this step you might conclude that you've bitten off way than you can chew trying to fix this alone. But trust me, adjusting the feeler arm is simpler than it sounds. The feeler arm is the sensor inside the ice maker that stops it from making too much ice. It alerts the ice maker when the ice tray is full. If the feeler arm is stuck, it won't be able to adjust itself according to the ice level in the tray. This will make the ice maker think that the tray is full when it isn't. The feeler arm could be stuck for a few reasons. Here are some of them: The feeler arm is frozenThe screws or springs on the feeler arm are stuck in place So what can you do if the feeler arm is frozen or if the screws and springs are stuck? Manually push down on the feeler arm. This should cause ice to break away from the arm. Push the feeler arm down repeatedly. This should loosen up the springs and screws if they have gotten stuck. How will you know if it has worked? Can you hear the tank in the ice maker begin to fill with water? If pushing on the feeler arm has loosened up the mechanism it will do this as it prepares to make more ice. Press the Reset Button If you don't think there's a problem with the feeler arm, you should try pressing the reset button. If you don't know where the reset button is on your ice maker, you should check your user guide. But let's be honest. Who really holds on to a user guide nowadays? If you can't find it, (or know that you've already chucked it) look for your reset button in the following places: At the bottom of the ice makerAbove the ice trayUnderneath the ice tray If that fails, you can simply Google it! Almost every manual is available online these days. Whirlpool host all of theirs online here: Once you have located the reset button, do the following: Press and hold the reset button.Hold onto the button for ten seconds or until you hear a beep inside the unit. Press the on/off Switch If you can't find the reset button nor the feeler arm, you can try pressing the on/off switch. This switch should also reset the ice maker and should get it working again properly. But where can you find the on/off switch? You should be able to see it in one of two places: Underneath the ice tray.Underneath the ice tray and cover plate. (For some Whirlpool ice maker models you have to remove both) Once you have located the on/off switch, do the following: Remove the ice tray and cover plate (or just the ice tray). You can do this by simply pulling on them.Turn the switch from on to off.Unplug the ice maker at the mains.Wait 10 minutes.Plug the ice maker in again.Turn the switch from off to on.Replace the ice tray and the cover plate as necessary.

This should reset the ice maker. Unplug the Appliance So what can you do if you are still struggling to reset your ice maker? If you are having trouble locating the reset button or the on/off switch, unplug the appliance. Doing so will reset the ice maker. Once you have unplugged the appliance you should do the following: Wait ten minutes before plugging it back in.Once plugged in, push on the feeler arm a couple of times. This will force water to pour into the ice maker which it will then cool and form into ice. The easiest way to get your ice maker working again is to simply unplug it for ten minutes What You Should Do if the Ice Maker Still Won't Reset? You've: Adjusted the feeler armPressed the reset button until you were blue in the faceFrantically pressed the on/off switchUnplugged the unit What can you do once you've tried everything but the ice maker still won't play ball? If you're still having problems, then the issue with your ice maker may be more complex. It will probably need more than a simple reset to fix it. What kind of problems am I talking about? Your ice maker may have one of the following issues: A mechanical malfunctionAn electrical problemA damaged part such as the water valve What should you do to fix problems like these? Take a look at the information below to find out: ProblemHow to Fix ItA Mechanical MalfunctionIf the problem is with the ice maker's mechanics, then you should call a professional to fix it. Attempting to fix mechanical problems on your own could invalidate your warranty. An Electrical ProblemIf the problem is electrical then you should call a professional to fix it. Attempting to fix electrical problems on your own could invalidate your home insurance. It could also render your ice maker's warranty invalid.A Damaged Part If one of the parts has broken, it may be simple for you to fix it with the help of spares. If the problem is with the feeler arm, removable ice tray, or cover plate, then you may be able to fix it yourself. If the problem lies with one of the internal parts, then you will need to call a professional to replace it. What should you do if you can't tell which category the problem falls into? In this case, consult your user manual. The manual will help you to troubleshoot some of the problems with the ice maker. This will help you to pinpoint the problem. If you don't have the manual, try contacting Whirlpool directly for more help. Why Do Ice Makers Need a Reset? Ice makers are a little bit like humans. (Hold on, there's an explanation coming.) Before you go on vacation you might feel a little cranky, worn out, and exhausted. After your vacation, you feel like you've recharged your batteries and are ready to face the world. Now, the reset button is kind of like a vacation for your ice maker: Your ice maker has had its buttons pushed a bunch of times and has worked non-stop around the clock. This could result in a confused and unresponsive appliance. I know what you're thinking, aren't these appliances supposed to be smart? Yes! They are, but unfortunately, the smarter the technology, the more there is that could go wrong with it. So, a little reset here and there helps to clear the system of a backlog of conflicting data. It will help it unwind and run smoothly again. Just like a couple of cocktails on the beach for 10 days does for every one of us. Conclusion It's important to have a well-functioning ice maker. This is especially true when the warm weather comes. Has your ice maker stopped working? Then a simple reset may be just what it needs to give it a new lease of life. Reconnect the power cord to the wall outlet. Turn the temperature control knob to the desired temperature. Locate the switch next to the water filter status light. Release the door alarm keypad and wait 3 seconds. Thereof, how do I run a diagnostic on my Whirlpool refrigerator? Starting Diagnostics To start with we need to start the refrigerator's diagnostic mode. To do this open the refrigerator door and press one or both door switches, depending on your refrigerator type. Next press the refrigerator temperature (+) button three times in ten seconds and release the light switch or switches.How do you troubleshoot a refrigerator? Check the temperature setting. Assure that there is enough room for air flow in the refrigerator or freezer. Check for air flow restrictions in vents. Test the temperature control. Clean the condensor coils. Check the door seals. Test the door switch. Test the defrost heater. If your Whirlpool Ice Maker is not working use this troubleshooting guide to diagnose common problems. Verify that the ice maker is turned on. If the ice maker's water supply is not connected to water supply line, turn the ice maker off. If the ice maker is on, but disconnected to water supply line, the following could happen: The ice maker will continue to try to make ice, causing a buzzing sound A refrigerator section may be too cold Food in crisper drawers may freeze First, ensure that ice is not jammed in the ejector arm of the ice maker. Remove jammed ice from the ejector arm using only a plastic utensil so the ice maker is not damaged. This will likely resolve the issue. Because the ice may not be completely frozen yet, when the harvest fingers try to harvest the ice cubes, the fingers bring up icy water that attaches to the stripper. This icy water can then freeze on the stripper during the next cycle causing an ice bridge. This ice bridge will cause the harvest fingers to jam. A clogged or incorrectly installed water filter will reduce the water flow to the ice maker and could cause thin, low or no ice production. Their filter selection tool will help you identify the right filter for your refrigerator or icemaker. Flush the system is needed every time the filter is changed or once the refrigerator is installed to the water supply line for the first time. Air in the water system may cause dripping at the dispenser or small/hollow ice cubes. CLICK HERE for more information on how to flush the water system. Check the water supply line When checking the water supply line, ensure the water supply is properly connected to a cold water supply and the water shutoff valve is fully opened. Next, check to make sure there are no kinks in the water supply line. A kink in the line can reduce water flow. Straighten the water source line to restore adequate water flow and pressure. To help reduce the chances of a pinched water line, do not push the refrigerator too far back against the wall or cabinet. While in "sleep" mode, the first press of a control button will only reactivate the display screen without changing any settings.Adjusting the ControlFor your convenience, your refrigerator and freezer controls are preset at the factory. When you first install your refrigerator, make sure that the controls are still set to the "mid-settings." The factory recommended set points are 37°F (3°C) for the refrigerator and 0°F (-18°C) for the freezer.-Wait 24 hours before you put food into the refrigerator. If you add food before the refrigerator has cooled completely, your food may spoil.NOTE: Adjusting the set points to a colder than recommended setting will not cool the compartments any faster.-If the temperature is too warm or too cold in the refrigerator or freezer, first check the air vents to be sure they are not blocked before adjusting the controls.-The preset settings should be correct for normal household usage.-The controls are set correctly when milk or juice is as cold as you like and when ice cream is firm.-Wait at least 24 hours between adjustments.-Recheck the temperatures before other adjustments are made.-To view and adjust the set points, press and hold the TEMP button for 3 seconds. To return the display setting to Fahrenheit, press LIGHT again.-When adjust mode is activated, the display screen shows the refrigerator set point and "FRIDGE" appears.-Press LOCK to raise the set point, or press OPTIONS to lower the set point.When you have finished viewing (and adjusting if desired) the refrigerator set point, press TMP to change the display to show the freezer set point. When the zone has been changed, "FREEZER" appears on the display screen.-Press LOCK to raise the set point, or press OPTIONS to lower the set point.-When you have finished viewing (and adjusting if desired) both the refrigerator and freezer set points, press MEASURED FILL to save the settings.NOTE: To exit without saving changes, press ICE TYPE at any time while in adjust mode, or allow about 60 seconds of inactivity and adjust mode will turn off automatically.Cooling On/Off-Your refrigerator and freezer will not cool when cooling is turned off.-To turn cooling off, press and hold the LOCK and MEASURED FILL buttons at the same time for 3 seconds.-IMPORTANT: To avoid unintentionally locking the dispenser or changing other settings, be sure to press both buttons at exactly the same time.-When cooling is off, "COOLING OFF" will appear on the display screen.Turning the Ice Maker On/Off:-The On/Off switch, located on the left wall of the freezer door, can only be accessed when the ice storage bin has been removed.-To turn on the ice maker, flip the switch to the ON (up) position.-To manually turn off the ice maker, flip the switch to the OFF (down) position.TO CHANGE THE WATER FILTER:-Locate the water filter in the top-right corner of the refrigerator compartment.-Lift open the filter cover door. The filter will be released and then be ejected as the door is opened.-When the door is completely open, pull the filter straight out.NOTE: There may be some water in the filter. Some spilling may occur. Use a towel to wipe up any spills.-Take the new filter out of its packaging and remove the cap.-Be sure the O-rings are still in place after the cap is removed.-With the arrow pointing up, align the new filter with the filter housing and slide it into place.
