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Ielts writing task 1 academic topics 2020 with answers pdf

Since publishing my blog post 50 recent IELTS essay questions (General Training and Academic), I have been flooded with requests for similar posts for Task One questions. So, today, I want to share some recent IELTS General Training Task 1 questions that appeared in the January 2021 exams. Again, these are questions that were reported by students of My IELTS Classroom that I have edited to be as close as possible to the real questions. However, I want to make it very clear that these are only reproductions of the exam questions. Therefore, if you have one of these questions in your exams CHECK THE BULLETS VERY CAREFULLY. I only have the memory of my students to help me write these questions and in the real exam the wording of the questions may be slightly (or extremely) different. So, as a disclaimer, I want to clearly state that it is highly unlikely that you will get one of these questions in your exam – I have reproduced these as practice material not “cheat sheets”. You should make sure that you have language to cover all of the common letter functions (i.e. apologising, suggesting, offering, complaining, etc) and write the three styles of letter (informal, semi-formal, formal). I cannot guarantee that these questions are 100% the same as the real exam questions. Always read the task carefully in your test (even if you recognise the question from this post). Check the bullets twice to make sure that you cover every single point. Remember, if you do not address all parts of the bullets, you will receive a 4.0 for Task Achievement. I have divided them into informal, semi-formal, and formal for you, and made some useful comments where I could. Have fun! Informal Letters There were relatively few informal questions reported in January. Unlike last year, when there were a wide range of questions and some for topics I have never seen before, I have only heard of three questions in 2021. Therefore, if you would like to practice with a wide range of questions, I recommend that you look at our 2020 IELTS letter archive to find more topics that you can use in your preparation until I can add more prompts from the exams in February. You recently went to a public event (for example an exhibition, festival, or show) that you think your friend would enjoy. Write a letter to friend. In your letter tell your friend what the event was explain why you think your friend would like the event invite them to come to the event with you You recently went to visit a friend in their new home. Write a letter to your friend. In your letter tell your friend what you liked about his/her new house say what you did or enjoyed most about your stay with your friend suggest when and where you could meet your friend next You are going to throw a party and would like to cook a special dish for your guests but do not have the recipe. Write a letter to your friend. In your letter tell your friend why you are having a party explain what dish you want to cook and ask your friend for the recipe invite your friend to the party You can listen to Nick and I discuss EIGHT of these prompts and how we would address them in our latest podcast episode! Just like in 2020, January saw the usual range of recipients of semi-formal letters (neighbours, colleagues and bosses) but there were some topics that I had never seen before asking your boss to move from full-time to part-time work complaining that your working environment has made you sick If you don't know what the difference is between a "formal" and "semi-formal" letter, then I strongly recommend that you watch my free video lesson, which clearly explains how the formality of your letter will affect the tone. Learn the difference here! Writing a mixed tone letter is one of the most common errors that I saw as an examiner and will also result in a very low Task Achievement score. You recently celebrated a special occasion in your personal life and received a card and a present from your colleagues at work. Write a letter to your colleagues. In your letter remind your colleagues what the special occasion you were celebrating was thank them for the card and gift explain why you like the gift and how you will use it You rent an apartment. You want to tell your landlord that you are happy with the apartment in general, but there are some small repairs that need to be carried out. Write a letter to your landlord. In your letter say what you like about the apartment describe the repairs that need to be made explain how the repairs will improve your quality of life You have seen a course advertised online that you think would help you perform better at work. The course will take place during the week, so you will need to take time off work. Write a letter to your manager. In the letter say what the course is explain why you want to do the course and how it will be beneficial to the company suggest how your work can be covered while you attend the course. You work in an office and have recently been experiencing a health problem. You think that the problem started because of the working conditions in the office. Write a letter to your manager. In your letter describe the health problem explain why you think it was caused by conditions in the office suggest what the manager should do to improve the working conditions in the office You are applying for a job in an international company. You would like to ask your previous employer to write a reference letter for you. Write a letter to your previous manager. In your letter remind your manager of the job you previously held in the company tell him / her what position you are applying for and why you want it ask him / her to provide you with a reference letter You currently work full-time in a company but would like to change to working part-time. Write a letter to your manager. In your letter explain why you would like to change to working part-time work say what times and days of the week would suit you best suggest how your work could be covered or completed if you work part-time You are currently taking an evening course at a local community college. However, you are not happy with the course. Write a letter to the manager of the college. In your letter say which course you are taking explain what the problem is with the course suggest what the manager should do to improve the course Formal Letters While there have been relatively few informal letters so far in 2021, the number and range of formal letters has definitely increased. And, while we still have the usual letters of complaint, there are a number of new question types here, which I would encourage you to practice before your test. The question that asks you to write to an antiques shop is especially unique! In the letter describe how well you can swim at the moment explain why you want to learn to swim better enquire about the time and cost of the swimming lessons You recently stayed in a hotel and left an item in the room. Write a letter to the manager of the hotel. In your letter: describe the item that you left in the room explain where you think the item might be suggest how the manager can return the item to you You have made a reservation in a hotel for a business trip for you and your colleagues. However, you need to make some changes to your booking. Write a letter to the hotel manager. In your letter give details of your current booking explain what changes you need to make and why ask the manager to make some special arrangements for your business meetings You have seen an advert in a newspaper for a part-time voluntary job working with children. Write a letter to the employment agency. In the letter say what the job you wish to apply for is explain why you want to apply for the job describe some of the skills and qualities you have that would be useful A local sports event is looking for people to voluntary/unpaid work. Write a letter to the organisers of the sports event to apply for the voluntary/unpaid work. In the letter explain why you want to do voluntary/unpaid work at the sports event describe some of the skills and qualities you have that would be useful suggest exactly how you could help at the event You have discovered a lot of rubbish in a lake near where you live. In the past, the lake had always been clean. Write a letter to the local council. In the letter describe the type of rubbish that you saw in the lake explain where you think the waste has come from suggest what the council should do about the problem You live in a block of flats. Your neighbour makes a lot of noise which is causing you some problems. Write a letter to your landlord. In the letter describe the noise that your neighbours are making explain how it is affecting you suggest what your landlord could do about the problem You are a member of a local gym. Recently, there has been a problem in the changing area. You have reported this to the staff several times, but no action was taken. Write a letter to the manager of the gym. The main criterion on which IELTS writing task 1 is measured are - Task Achievement, Vocabulary, Coherence and Cohesion, and Grammatical accuracy. While IELTS academic writing task 1 deals with infographic-related questions, the IELTS general writing task 1 deals with letter writing. Both IELTS academic and general writing task 1 are marked on a score range of 0 - 9. For IELTS academic writing task 1, candidates need to write a report on the analysis of pie chart, bar graph, line graph or chart. Also, check out: IELTS Exam Pattern The main purpose of the IELTS academic writing task 1 is to test the reasoning and analytical skills of the candidates who are gearing up to study abroad. Now, abroad universities have a distinct manner of teaching which is not cliched. They expect their students to meticulously analyze bars/graphs/tables/flow-charts/diagrams and more. The IELTS writing task 1 academic topics 2020 shows how diversified the question types are. The following diagram explains the IELTS academic writing task 1: In the IELTS Academic writing task 1, candidates are required to write a short report by analyzing information provided in the chart, graph, tables, or a combination of these. The type of diagram can be any and it can be easy or complicated. For writing task 1 Academic, candidates have to depict the graphical representation and need to write a report in 150 words in 20 minutes. It will be better if the candidates don't exceed the word limit because there is no extra credit for writing extra. The IELTS academic writing task 1 samples is a great helper in this regard. IELTS Academic Writing Task 1 Question Types The IELTS academic writing task 1 consists of 6 question types and they are: Charts Graphs (bar, pie, line or any) Tables Maps Diagram Or a combination of any of these Few IELTS Academic Writing task 1 sample questions are mentioned below - Check out: IELTS Writing Practice Papers The IELTS academic writing task 1 question should include: Explanation of the image Summarizing the key features from the image Pointing out the similarities and differences from the image Explain the function from the image The diagram can be of a machine, device, or process and the candidates will be asked to explain how it works. The IELTS writing task 1 samples academic with answers is a great way to receive guidance. A comparison of data is very common in the questions of IELTS academic writing task 1, so the candidate needs to practice these types of questions more. Whether bar chart or pie chart task 1 IELTS usually comprises data taken from the sales of commodities, or living styles of a particular community. Most of these academic topics are taken to make the test-takers well aware of data and graphs. IELTS academic writing task 1 score is measured on the basis of four components as mentioned below: Task achievement (25%) Coherency (25%) Vocabulary (25%) Grammatical Accuracy (25%) Marks can be deducted for generalized content, off-topic content, poorly connected sentences, irrelevant sentences, and plagiarized content in this task. There is a penalty for exceeding the word count as well as for not meeting the word count. How do I Start IELTS Academic Writing Task 1? For a good IELTS band score, it is recommended to follow the proper structure for this task. Note: An answer booklet will be given and the candidates need to write their IELTS academic writing task 1. A general and crisp introduction; The opening sentence must be in connection with the image as well as to the question made; Body paragraphs can be termed as overview and candidates can write the exact values from the picture by quoting these. This paragraph must not contain any generic sentence - it will be a direct answer to the question. The candidates are free to make the body paragraphs precise, but these must contain relevant sentences, facts, and figures. Remember, the subjective conclusion is not needed here as this task only looks for the ability of the candidates to understand and write about the graphical image given. The writing task requires to be written in an academic or semi-formal or neutral style. To check how IELTS academic writing task 1 is constructed, the candidates can check the IELTS writing solved papers. How can I Improve my IELTS Academic Writing Task 1? Writing Task 1 Academic is slightly different than the Writing task 1 general question types, apart from studying the IELTS academic writing task 1 sample, it is important to remember the following IELTS writing tips: Candidates should first notice if the question requires a comparison or summary. then accordingly deal with it; Remember, for the comparison questions, giving a general summary by interpreting the data of the image is not the requirement of this task - the candidates have to answer the question followed by the image. They need to check for similarities and differences in response to the question. The picture may represent a wide array of data, out of which, you need to pick the relevant ones. You have to sort the information given here and this is not an easy thing to do. Regular practice of IELTS writing can help here. So, that's all about IELTS academic writing task 1.
