## How to combine pdf files in one pdf

Combining PDF files usually requires the purchase or download of a decent PDF reader. But when you need to quickly merge your files, and don't have an advanced enough PDF reader on your computer, there's a more efficient way of combining your files than buying and downloading software. There are free PDF merging tools online that let you merge your files with any device and operating system. We'll list some of the best available below.

- 8 Online Tools that Can Merge PDF Files for Free
1. Combine PDF Combine PDF lets you upload PDF and image files from your computer, Google Drive, or Dropbox, adjust their order, and download them as a single PDF document.
2. Sejda Sedja lets you upload PDF and image files from your computer, Google Drive, and Dropbox, reorder them in any way you want, generate a table of contents, merge them into one PDF document, and save your document to Dropbox. You can even scan physical documents with your phone, email them to Sejda, and they'll merge and send your combined PDF document to you in a matter of seconds.
3. PDF2GO PDF2GO lets you drag and drop PDFs, documents, spreadsheets, presentations, and images from your computer, Google Drive, Dropbox, and even the internet. You can also adjust the order of your files before you merge them into a single PDF document.
4. PDF Joiner PDF Joiner lets you drag and drop up to 20 PDF and image files into its uploader, arrange their order, and merge them into one PDF document.
5. DocuPub DocuPub lets you merge PDFs, documents, spreadsheets, presentations, and images from your computer into one PDF document. Just make sure you upload them in your preferred order before you download your merged document.
6. SmallPDF Small PDF lets you drag and drop your PDF files from your computer, Google Drive, or Dropbox into its uploader, rearrange their order, and merge them into a single PDF document. They also permanently deletes your files from their servers within an hour of upload to protect your privacy.
7. Soda PDF Soda PDF lets you upload PDF files from your computer, Google Drive, or Dropbox, adjust the order of your files, and download the merged file onto your computer or send it to your email address.
8. Hipdf Hipdf lets you drag and drop PDF files from your computer, Google Drive, Dropbox, Microsoft Online, and Box into its uploader and arrange their order in any way you want. Their servers will also permanently delete your files within an hour of upload to maximize your security.

Combine Files > Add Files > Combine. Apple Preview: Open a PDF and select View Thumbnails. Select an insert location. Choose Edit > Insert > Page from File. PDF Merge: Go to the PDF Merge website, select Choose File, select a PDF, and choose Open. Repeat for the second PDF. Select Merge. This article explains how to combine PDF files into one document using Acrobat DC, Mac Preview, and the PDF Merge website. Additional information is provided for combining PDFs on mobile devices and using Combine PDF and Merge PDF. Adobe Acrobat Reader is free. You can use Acrobat Reader to view and print PDF files, as well as add annotations. To further manipulate these files or combine multiple PDFs into one, install Acrobat DC. Follow these steps to merge PDF files with Adobe Acrobat DC: Open Acrobat DC and select Tools > Combine Files. Select Add Files to add as many files as you would like. Select Add Open Files to include documents you're currently viewing. Adjust the order, including that of individual pages, by dragging and dropping each to the desired location. Select Combine to complete the process. Acrobat DC is available for a monthly or yearly subscription fee that varies based on the application version and length of commitment. If you have a short-term need, Adobe offers a 7-day free trial, which doesn't contain limitations in terms of functionality. On a Mac, use the built-in Preview application to combine PDF files, eliminating the need (and cost, as Preview is free with macOS) for third-party software or an online service. Open one of the PDF files you want to combine in the Preview app. Go to the View menu and select Thumbnails, if it isn't selected, to enable the thumbnail preview. To toggle the Thumbnails view, press Option+Command+2 on the keyboard. If the open PDF has more than a single page, select a thumbnail in the left panel where you want to insert another PDF file. Inserted PDF pages appear after the selected page. Select Edit > Insert > Page from File. In a Finder window, locate the second PDF file you want to import into the current one, then select Open. Repeat steps 4 and 5 for each additional PDF file you want to import. Drag thumbnails to change the order of pages. When you are satisfied with the combined PDF, select File > Save. Several websites offer PDF merging services. Many are ad-driven and free of charge. One of these is PDF Merge, which makes it possible to upload multiple files using a web browser. There is a limit of 10 MB for files that are uploaded. PDF Merge also offers an affordable downloadable app that merges PDFs offline. Only a Windows version is available. Go to the PDF Merge website. Select Choose File. Choose the first PDF you want to merge, then select Open. Select Choose File again for the other files you want to combine. If you run out of slots, select More Files. Select Merge to combine the selected files. The files are combined in the order in which you select and upload each file. Download the final combined PDF to your computer. Combine PDF is a web-based tool that merges multiple PDF documents into a single PDF file. Merge up to 20 files, including images, into a single PDF file for free. Combine PDF claims to delete all files from their servers within one hour of upload. Go to the Combine PDF tab, if it isn't selected. Drag the PDF files to the PDF Merge web page. Or, upload the files in the traditional fashion by selecting Upload Files. Adjust the order of the uploaded files by dragging the files in the queue. Select Combine. The merged PDF file, combinepdf.pdf, downloads to your computer. Merge PDF, part of the Smallpdf.com site, is a free browser-based solution that incorporates files from your local device, Dropbox, and Google Drive. Before you combine the files into one PDF file, use Merge PDF to drag-and-drop files to reorder or delete the pages as you please. All uploads and downloads are deemed secure, and files are permanently deleted from the Smallpdf servers within an hour. The site also offers other PDF-related services, including viewing and editing tools, and the ability to convert file formats. Select either From Google Drive or From Dropbox to open a login window. Enter your login credentials for the cloud service to see your cloud-based files. Select the files you want to upload, then select Choose. There are Android and iOS apps that combine PDF files on a smartphone or tablet. Many mobile apps that promise this functionality either do not deliver the expected results or are poorly developed, resulting in frequent crashes and other unreliable behavior. These options are the most reliable: PDF Utils: This often-updated app combines a large number of PDF files from an Android device and has other useful features. Basic functionality is available without a fee, while an ad-free experience can be had with in-app purchases. PDF Utility: Despite some limitations in the free edition of this Android app, including a maximum file size of 2.5 MB, PDF Utility quickly merges two or more PDF documents. The pro version lifts this restriction and removes all ads. PDF Converter: This iOS app combines PDF files on an Apple iPhone or iPad fairly easily. In-app purchases remove some size and file number limitations. PDF Expert: One of the better-known and stable iOS apps on this list. Open PDF, select thumbnails, and drag into Thumbnails sidebar of the new PDF. Save. Adobe Acrobat: Find Combine Files and select Use Now > Add Files. Choose files, then select Add Files. Order as you wish. Select Combine. Combine PDF: Go to Combine PDF and select Upload Files. Choose files. Select Download. Rearrange as needed. Choose Combine. If you need to combine multiple PDF files into a single file, and you have a Mac, you can easily combine several PDFs for free. Whether you use software that comes with your Mac, websites, or paid options, here's what you need to know about how to combine PDF files on any version of macOS. The Preview program that comes pre-installed on every Mac provides a super-simple way to combine PDF files for free. Just follow these steps: Open the PDF files you want to combine using Preview. The Preview app is located in the Applications folder on your Mac. Make sure page thumbnails are visible on both PDFs by clicking the sidebar button and clicking Thumbnails. On one PDF, select the thumbnails. You can select all of them by clicking command+A, or individual pages by holding down Shift and then clicking on the pages you want to merge. Drag the thumbnails you selected in the last step 3 into the Thumbnails sidebar on the other PDF. This merges the new pages into the existing PDF. To choose where in the merged file the new PDF is added, drag and drop in the sidebar to put the file in the proper order. You can also re-arrange the pages in the Thumbnails sidebar after dragging and dropping the new PDF, if you prefer. Save the new, combined PDF. If you've got Adobe Acrobat—which is part of Adobe's Creative Cloud line of high-end graphics, animation, and publishing programs—you can merge PDFs using that program instead. Here's what to do: You can only do this with the paid version of Adobe Acrobat. The free Adobe Acrobat Reader program can't combine PDFs and just prompts you to upgrade to the paid version. Open Adobe Acrobat. From the homescreen of Adobe Acrobat, find the Combine Files section and click Use Now. If this option isn't displayed by default for you, click See All Tools first. Click Add Files. A Finder window pops up. Navigate to the PDFs you want to combine and select them. You can select them one at a time, select files next to each other by holding down Shift when you click, or select files that aren't next to each other by holding down Command when you click. When you've selected all the files you want to combine, click Add Files. All of the files you're going to combine are displayed. You can drag and drop them to change their order in the combined PDF. When they're in the order you want, click Combine. After the files are combined, the merged PDF is displayed. You can still re-order the pages here, if you want. Click Page Thumbnails in the sidebar and then drag and drop the pages to re-order. Save the PDF. If you prefer to combine your PDFs using a free online tool, you've got a number of options. For these instructions, we chose Combine PDF, but there are a number of other good options out there. We also like PDF Merge. To use Combine PDF, follow these steps: In your preferred web browser, go to the Combine PDF website. Click Upload Files. Navigate through your hard drive to find and select the PDFs you want to combine and then click Choose. You can also drag and drop the PDFs into the page, if you prefer that route. The PDFs will upload and then convert for use by the website. Wait until that process has completed and both PDFs show the Download option. Drag and drop the files to change the order in which they'll be merged. Click Combine to merge the PDFs (and, if your browser prompts you with a security warning, click Allow). The combined PDF automatically downloads to your Mac's Downloads folder. The PDF will be named combinepdf.pdf.
